

## **Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)**

### **1. What is a “non-public place”?**

A non-public place refers to a place in which members of public have no access to. This includes:

- a) Residential homes (excluding common spaces such as void decks)
- b) Private function rooms within privately owned premises (e.g. Condominiums)
- c) Private rooms in hotels and country clubs
- d) Office premises (in which only employees have access to)

### **2. If I am delivering liquor to non-public places, can I continue to supply liquor/beer at my licensed premise?**

No. You may not sell or supply any form of liquor at your licensed premise outside the trading hours stated on your liquor licence.

### **3. Can I sell liquor/beer at any time if the customers request for the liquor/beer to be delivered to non-public places?**

You may not sell liquor/beer over the counter or at your licensed premise after the trading hours stated on your liquor licence. However, if you are a licence holder of an online business, your customers can place their orders through the online service anytime.

The ordered liquor/beer can be delivered to any place during the trading hours. Delivery after the trading hours can only be made to a non-public place.

### **4. Will the delivery to non-public places apply to my online liquor business?**

If you are a licence holder of an online business, your customers can place their orders through the online service anytime.

The ordered liquor/beer can be delivered by the Licence Holder, or through a delivery service engaged by the Licence Holder, to any place during the trading hours. Delivery after the trading hours can only be made to a non-public place.

### **5. When can I deliver liquor to public places?**

You may deliver liquor to public places during the existing retail/wholesale trading hours under the Liquor Control (Supply and Consumption) Act:

- a) From 0700hrs to 2230hrs daily; and
- b) Within a Liquor Control Zone:
  - i. From 0700hrs to 2230hrs on Weekdays; and
  - ii. From 0700hrs to 1900hrs on Weekends, Public Holiday and eve of a Public Holiday.
